REFLECTIONS

FROM THE DOULA

The view from where I sit writing this year-end reflection compared to last could not be more different. Not only am I heavily pregnant with a surprise fourth baby, but I'm also working from a home office versus the brick-and-mortar we labored so hard to establish. In this report, you'll also see the faces of four additional doulas who have been onboarded to the Mother Well team. Last December, I could not have pictured myself being an agency owner!

Reflecting on the births I've been privileged to support, I noticed trends that were starkly different from years prior. With roughly the same sample size of clients, my practice's c-section rate more than doubled from 2021 to 2022 (going from 9% to 23%). There was also a major jump in the induction rate (31% in the prior year to 56% in this current year). Homebirth transfers also increased. And this is the first year a client who intended a VBAC birthed via repeat Cesarean.

While those statistics might be a departure from past trends, I'm still grateful that the numbers are spot on from a public health perspective! Remember that the Healthy People 2030 target is a Cesarean birth rate of around 23.6%, and our state average Cesarean birth rate is 34.3%. I do believe the pandemic, a general sense of increased stress, and our current national healthcare crisis played a role in these outcomes. But often, there's no simple explanation for a multi-faceted experience like childbirth.

Doula care is sometimes touted as *the* way to reduce the rate of c-sections and other interventions. The reality is more like Aaron Burr in Manuel-Miranda's Hamilton put it, "I am the one thing in life I can control." Doulas can control their presence, their knowledge, and their positive contributions to birth.

Likewise, doulas support clients in controlling their own responses to pregnancy, childbirth, and new parenthood.

Thinking about the families who walked through the unexpected this year, I'm struck by how attentive they were to their own instincts. I'm inspired by their courage and compassion. I saw mothers get deeply in tune with their bodies and their babies. I held space as parents made the best decisions with the best information supported by the best team available.

In my 7 years of doula experience, I've encouraged countless mothers to 'open and release' to the waves of labor - and to the ebb and flow of a birth plan. I believe this approach is the most gracious and gentle. Make plans with wisdom and in good faith. Then, release yourself from the pressure of controlling outcomes. Open your heart to receiving your baby and transforming into the parent you were made to be.

Admittedly, 2022 was a bit of a taxing year. And yet, walking with families through so many unknowns and unforseen turns only solidified my love of birthwork and the belief that expecting families deserve high-quality support. After maternity leave, my eyes are set on ways to further bolster expecting parents during this monumental life event.



BIRTH-Y MILESTONES

1st Time Catching a Baby

Thanks to a quickly progressing homebirth, I unexpectedly caught a baby about twenty mins before the midwife arrived! I'm thankful that I was able to remain calm and competent in that unexpected situation. I was also grateful for my certification in the Neonatal Resuscitation Program in case the baby needed some extra help. All was well, mom and baby were fabulous!

Neared 100 Doula Babies Born

I closed the year with 97 families supported in birth. And I've already got clients on next year's calendar that will push me over the edge to 100 total! (Though counting the times I've been a homebirth midwife assistant, I have surpassed 100 births attended.)

'Oldest' Post-Dates Baby Born

One mama made it to 42 weeks and 3 days before her little one was ready to be born!

'Youngest' Premature Baby Born

Despite not being able to attend in person due to the situation, a client of mine this year delivered a baby at 30 weeks.

Doula Double-Headers Continued

April and August continued to be 'Babypalloza' months at Mother Well. In both of those months, two clients gave birth within 24 hours of each other. In one of these cases, a backup doula was utilized when 2 clients were in laboring at the same time.

Most Related Clients

It's all in the family! I had the most family overlap in a client year! 2 clients were from one family, and 2 from another! So fun to support cousins!

Longest Cesarean Birth

This year, one of my clients had a 3-hour c-section due to an unexpected finding in her uterus!

Highly Recommend! Victoria was amazing before birth, during birth and during postpartum care!

Being my first preganancy, my husband and I were nervous about the entire process. The unknown can be really scary! Victoria walked us through every step of the way to prepare us for the entire experience. She was highly knowledgeable of our hospital policies including what equipment/materials the hospital had available so we could request them when we arrived.

I had a high risk preganancy that quickly moved to an induction due to a fetal growth restriction. My induction was verrryyy slow. (72 hours!) Victoria checked in along the way and gave suggestions with positioning and comfort. When she arrived at the hospital, she quickly jumped into gear and began collborating with the L&D nurses. She was a great asset to the team and took the lead on positioning (after 3 days in the hospital, I was ready to get up and moving). During birth, she provided suggestions to my midwife and made sure I remained comfortable. The one thing I kept talking about was how I wanted a Jimmy Johns turkey sandwhich. As soon as I gave birth, she had my order waiting! It's the small things that make such an impact!

Not only is Victoria a great doula, but she's also a wonderful person that does so much for our community!

Closed our Brick & Mortar & Moved back to a Home Office

With the news of an unexpected pregnancy, we spent the first half of the year evaluating our business plans. In the second half of the year, we put those plans in place. One of those pivots was the decision to close 'The Mother Well' at 406 Chestnut Street. While this doula practice continues to go strong, we decided it wasn't the time for aggressive growth at an in-person location. But we're hopeful that if an opportunity presents itself in the future, we'll be able to again have a community hub for families.

With the closing of our brick-and mortar, our online shop no longer carries physical products. We are moving towards being a digital shop full of resources and classes for doulas and parents!

Onboarded New Doulas
